Section A: Overview





Funding to provide zerointerest, forgivable student loans for behavioral health programs.

Nurse Practitioner (NP) Expansion Grant Program

Funding to launch and/or expand graduate NP programs to help 135 students to become psychiatric mental health nurse practitioners (PMHNPs) in public settings

Behavioral Health Apprenticeship Network Program

Section A: Overview

- PIC and Trailhead are seeking proposals from County of San Diego (County)-funded behavioral health service providers to create culturally diverse licensed clinician talent pipeline by providing high-quality internships to master's students in relevant education programs that lead to licensure as social workers (LCSWs), marriage and family therapists (LMFTs) and professional clinical counselors (LPCCs).
- **Up to \$6,500,000 total** is potentially available for up to four (4) lead agencies, including one specifically focused and specializing in serving the behavioral needs of children and youth.
- Funding is available to support County-funded behavioral health service providers train and provide clinical supervision to between 320-400 social work, therapy, and/or clinical counseling trainees between September 2025 and June 30th, 2029













Section A: Goals

The goals of the RFP are to:

- 1. Expand the County-funded behavioral health system's capacity to provide high-quality training and supervision opportunities for students
- 2. Support students' conversion and retention into associate clinicians in the County-funded behavioral health system.

The ELEVATE Behavioral Health Workforce Fund's vision for the licensed clinician pathway is below. Funding for Step 1 and Step 5 (blue boxes) is provided by the ELEVATE Behavioral Health Workforce Fund Pay it Forward Loan Program (link). Funding from this RFP is designed to support Step 2, Step 3, and Step 4 (orange boxes).

STEP 5 STEP 1 Licensed Eligible Clinicians individuals may continue take out the employment at **ELEVATE** Pay it County-Funded Forward 0% behavioral health Interest, site to receive Forgivable Loan loan forgiveness













Section A: Eligible Lead Agencies

PIC and Trailhead intend to contract with four (4) County-funded behavioral health service providers to serve as lead agencies as community behavioral health internship and supervision anchor sites.

A list of County-funded behavior health organizations eligible to serve as lead agency can be found in **Section**H: Attachment A.

One of the lead agencies will be focused on the children and youth (pediatrics) population.

**Note: We have received inquiries and a few compelling examples suggesting opening up the eligibility for intermediaries to be eligible to serve as a lead agency. This is under consideration and we will post written guidance on the ELEVATE website on or before Monday, July 28th about this matter.

The requirement that interns and associate placements must occur in County-funded or other approved sites will remain unchanged.













Partnerships

- Lead agencies are strongly encouraged to partner with organizations that serve specialty populations that may not have the internal capacity, university partnerships, or licensed staff required to host interns or provide associate clinician supervision on their own.
- The goal of these funds are to support high-quality internship and associate placement opportunities at a range of training sites, programs, settings, and organizations serving the behavioral health needs of diverse populations, with an emphasis on threshold languages and geographical representation from across the County













Attachment A: ELEVATE BH Fund Eligible Employers

Partners eligible to host interns and associates in each network:

- The Social Work, Therapy, and Counseling Internship Program is designed to support and supervise interns and associates in County-funded behavioral health programs operated by employers included on the ELEVATE Behavioral Health Workforce Fund Eligible Employer List in Section H: Attachment A
- This list will be updated quarterly to reflect new providers that obtain contracts awarded by the County of San Diego Health and Human Services Agency, Behavioral Health Services (BHS).
- Once included on the ELEVATE Behavioral Health Workforce Fund Eligible Employer List, an employer will remain eligible under this program, even if its contract with BHS is later modified or discontinued during the project period.
- The Social Work, Therapy and Counseling Internship Program providers that are not on the ELEVATE Behavioral Health Workforce Fund Eligible Employer List will be considered on a case-by-case basis. To be considered, the participant must be placed with an employer that: (1) Provides behavioral health services to residents in San Diego County, (2) is a non-profit community-based organization and/or a FQHC, and/or (3) serves San Diego clients who are enrolled or eligible for Medi-Cal and/or Medicare.*





Section A: Project Timeline

The project will be implemented in three phases:

- 1. Lead Agency Start-Up Phase: (September-December 2025): Lead agencies will use this time to set up internship and associate supervision opportunities with a diverse set of programs and settings at the lead agency and partner County-funded BH providers, expand partnerships with universities, hire and onboard new staff, develop additional didactics, develop a standardized, high-quality internship and supervision experience, and implement any other structural changes in preparation for new interns and associates.
- 2. Social Work, Therapy, and Counseling Intern and Associate Enrollment Period: (January 1st 2026 June 30th 2029): Three-and-a-half year period in which awarded lead agencies and their partner networks will train, hire, and supervise new interns and associates through high-quality training opportunities, and incentivize (e.g., stipends, hiring and retention bonuses), and support them toward licensure and their future employment in County-funded behavioral health.
- 3. Post-Enrollment Follow-Up Period: (July 1st, 2029 June 30th, 2032): Three year period in which the lead agency may be asked to report back on a set of outcomes related to trainees who received support during the enrollment period.

- 1. Licensed Clinician Pathway Partnership Network Establishment
- 2. Internship Placement and Support
- 3. Associate Clinician Hiring, Supervision, and Retention
- 4. Reporting and Continuous Improvement













Section C: Allowable Expenditures

Up to \$6,500,000 total is potentially available across up to four (2) lead agencies for individuals enrolled before June 2029.

Budgets should not exceed **\$1,625,000**

SUBCONTRACTOR AGREEMENT

This Subcontractor Agreement (this "Agreement") is entered into between Policy & Innovation Center, a California nonprofit public benefit corporation d/b/a San Diego Regional Policy and Innovation Center ("PIC"), Trailhead Strategies Inc., a California stock corporation ("Trailhead"), and [INSERT NAME], a [INSERT TYPE OF LEGAL ENTITY AND STATE OF FORMATION] ("[NAME]" or "Subcontractor"), effective as of the date on which it is fully executed by PIC, Trailhead and [NAME] below (the "Effective Date"). PIC, Trailhead and Subcontractor are referred to herein together as the "Parties" and each individually as a "Party." Any capitalized terms not defined in this Agreement shall have the meaning assigned in the County Agreement (as defined below).

RECITALS

WHEREAS, PIC is a Section 501(c)(3) tax-exempt public charity dedicated to building resilient and inclusive communities that can adapt, persist, and thrive through changing and challenging circumstances:

WHEREAS, Trailhead is a workforce and economic development consulting company dedicated to building a more inclusive, resilient, and competitive American workforce;

WHEREAS, PIC and the County of San Diego, a political subdivision of the State of California (the "County"), are the parties to that certain County Contract Number 57/2148, Agreement with San Diego Regional Policy and Innovation Center for Public Behavioral Health Workforce Development and Retention Fund Administrator, effective as of October 11, 2024, attached hereto as Exhibit 1 (such agreement, as now in effect and as may be further amended, the "County Agreement"), pursuant to which PIC agreed to establish and administer the Public Behavioral Health Workforce and Retention Program (the "Program") for the County of San Diego's Health and Human Services Agency ("HHSA") as described in the County Agreement;

WHEREAS, the Program's purpose is to distribute and monitor the use of funding to support individuals seeking a variety of training, tuition support, upskilling, and incentive opportunities designed to attract and retain workers in the public behavioral health field;

WHEREAS, PIC's contract award is pursuant to the bid proposal that PIC submitted in response to HHSA RFP 735 on behalf of a collaboration among PIC (as lead offeror), Trailhead and other subcontractors including Social Finance (collectively, the "Coalition");

WHEREAS, such bid proposal and the County Agreement reflect that PIC will utilize services from various organizations and partners to design and provide certain program management and delivery services for the Upskilling to Meet Professional Needs programs (the "Upskilling Programs"), a series of programs for workers seeking to advance their education, training and/or certification who may not have the income or ability to finance education or certifications, and/or capacity to take on student debt, to be provided by training and educational
